Society Hosted Courtney Cottrell of The Brothertown Indian Nation For Talk

On April 17, 2017 at the Chilton Public Library, the Calumet County Historical Society hosted Courtney Cottrell of the Brothertown Indian Nation for a presentation to the public about the History of the Brothertown Indian tribe who once had its reservation here in Calumet County.

Courtney is the Tribal Historic Preservation Officer for the Brothertown Indian Nation and is currently a Doctoral Candidate in

Anthropology at the University of Michigan.

The presentation was a short overall history of how the Brothertown Indians became a tribe and their journey from the Eastern United States to Wisconsin in the early 1800's. The Brothertown tribe elected in 1839 to become United States citizens to avoid having to be relocated, yet again, to another reservation in Minnesota. Ms. Cottrell talked about this decision and how the present day tribe is trying to petition the United

States government to reinstate the tribe its Native American status.

It was a wonderful presentation with a nice turn out by the general public. The Calumet County Historical Society would like to keep providing such programs for the public in the future. Local Brewery History

There were two large breweries located in Chilton. Becker Brewery was located on what is now 220 West Main Street. The original buildings were built by J. Paulus around 1860. It was bought by Philip Becker in 1875 on which improvements were made and a capacity of 1,000 barrels a year were produced

annually. A beer garden with a circular band stand was erected next to the Brewery, in which the patrons could enjoy nice German music while drinking their beverages. The beer was delivered by wagon and draft horses, as many as 26 horses were housed in the stables. Mr. Becker erected a nice brick home, in 1881, with a cupola

on the top. That home is still standing today. In 1885 the Brewery was purchased by Jung and Borchert. In 1892 Pabst Brewery purchased the Brewery and owned it until 1918, using it mostly for storage.

The second Brewery in Chilton was the Calumet Brewing Co. It was founded in 1853 by F.R. Gutheil at the corner of Park and Main Streets. It was sold to Jackels and Thomas in 1875. Operated by Thomas and

Digitizing and documenting our collections is a daunting, but essential task because it will allow us to preserve photos stories and so much more for future generations.

The Calumet County Historical Society is always looking for new volunteers. Our volunteers do everything from data entry, as mentioned, cataloging items in our collection (taking photos and writing descriptions of items), landscaping, lawn cutting, general maintenance and also manning the Museum on Sundays. Albert Freyer from 1883 to 1890, in which Albert Freyer became sole owner in 1890. Then in 1893 it was sold again to Herman Gierow. From 1893 to 1907 it was known as the Gierow and Hoch Brewery. Herman Gierow

had married the daughter of large Brewery owner in Michigan, then he came to Chilton in 1892 looking to purchase a Brewery of his own. Mr. Gierow was actively engaged in all aspects of the Brewery during his ownership and even after he sold it. Unfortunately he died in 1914 from a fall that he took while working in the Malt house. From 1907 – 1910 it became known as the Chilton Brewery and was owned by Walter Kroenke and M. Landgraf. In

1911 it became Calumet Brewing Co. and operated as such until 1942. John N. Landgraf was the president up to prohibition. In 1934 after prohibition was repealed a new Brewing Co. was formed and became known as Steiner's Calumet Brewing. However,

this venture did not prosper and was closed for back taxes and all the beer was dumped in the river. Edward Bonk purchased the real estate at public auction, and a new Calumet Brewing Co. was incorporated. The main shareholder's

where Edward Bonk, Helen Sonntag, and Helmuth F. Arps. Under this new ownership the Badger Brand Beer was produced and sold.

In February of 1937 Henry Rahr III of Manitowoc, purchased the Brewery and changed the name to Henry Rahr Brewing Co. This too, only lasted a few months and in 1938, the Brewery was purchased by Herman and Gertude Rau and D.D. Humleker. The Brewery AGAIN, became the Calumet Brewing Co until it was closed in 1942

See Calumet Brewing Co. in red box in the picture. You can see it was located across the street from the present day Briess Malthouse. The building in the foreground was the Dumke



mill.
